Membership Update

Regarding the Drinking Water Settlement Applications for the Class Action Litigation on Drinking Water Advisories on First Nations Lands

Upon receiving the note for eligibility of LTFN for this Class Action Litigation on Drinking Water Advisories, LTFN administration have put an effort to help every eligible person to make an application. We have sent all applications in as of 3PM, March 7, 2024, which we received on the Northside and Downtown office.

Meanwhile, Council also took an effort with administration to provide with a list to administrators of the settlement which is called a Band Council Confirmation List (BCCL). Things to note:

1. If same person is included in BCCL and also sends an application, the application information triumphs over the BCCL and used to make the decision by the administrators.
2. Anyone who may not have sent an application, if included in the BCCL, will be considered by the administrators for settlement as per the eligibility.
3. Inclusion in the BCCL or sending an application doesn't guarantee to be eligible to receive the settlement amount. The band is not in any way involved in that decision process.

Next Steps:

After the deadline (March 7, 2024 midnight), the administrators will start reviewing the BCCL and individual applications. The band is not involved in the process of reviewing, or we will not have any information related to the process. The eligibility decision will be communicated with the claimant directly by the administrators. Those who will be deemed approved as eligible for this settlement will receive their entitled amount directly from the administrators.

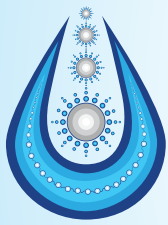

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN you submit a claim?

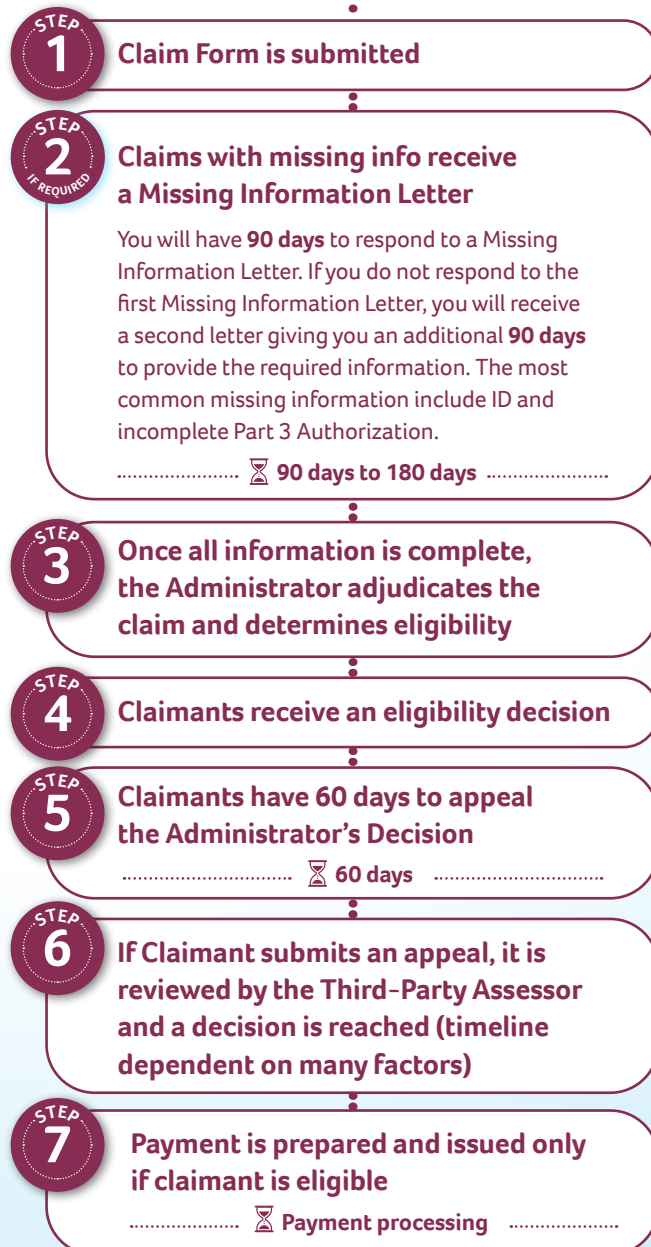
This infographic shows what happens to an Individual Claim once it has been submitted to the Administrator. This process is for Individual Claim Forms only and does not include claims submitted by Band Councils, Representative Claim Forms (e.g., estate or minors) or Specified Injuries.

The Claims Process is a legal process that sets out timelines for each step that must occur within a minimum number of days, so that claimants have enough time to respond and provide the required information. If you receive a letter with a deadline, please make sure you note what actions you need to take and by what date.
